


NURSERY NEWSLETTER

<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development.</p>		<p>This week the children learnt about Bonfire night and Diwali. The children learnt about Guy Fawkes and listened to the story and talked about why we now celebrate bonfire night. We also looked at what to wear when going to a firework event.</p>
<p>Physical Development</p>		<p>The children used the blocks and tissue paper to build a bonfire outside. They talked about the colour of fire and used the tissue paper to represent this. Inside the children made rockets and firework pictures. The children also made a large firework display which for our topic board.</p>
<p>Communication and Language</p>		<p>The children also talked about different firework displays and the colours they could see. They shared their experiences of bonfire night and talked about how to be careful when using fireworks.</p>
<p>Numeracy</p>		<p>This week the children learnt about matching numbers to object. They role played this using various items. The children were given numbers 1-10/20 and were shown a number and asked to find the right amount of objects. The children also worked with partners to make multilink number towers.</p>
<p>Literacy</p>		<p>In phonics the children learnt to listen for words in sentences. They also continued listening for sounds in the environment and made different sounds using instruments, objects and their bodies.</p>
<p>Art and Design</p>		<p>The children continued their weekly singing sessions with the music teacher. They painted their own fireworks pictures and decorated their rockets. While in class the children learnt the months of the year song and practised singing this outside with their friends.</p>
<p>Understanding the World</p>		<p>In understanding of the world the children learnt about the celebration of Bonfire Night. They looked at the Autumn season and were able to talk about the colours and things that they could see.</p>
<p>Homework</p>		<p>We would like to thank the families whose children bring their homework. Next week our topic will be Oliver's Vegetables. Can the children draw and label a picture of their favourite vegetables and write their name on their work?</p>
