


NURSERY NEWSLETTER

<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development.</p>		<p>This week the children talked about the importance to stay close to your parents when walking in public and how dangerous it is to talk to strangers.</p>
<p>Physical Development</p>		<p>The children used the building blocks to build a bridge for the Gingerbread man. They designed their bridge and then built it following their design. They also enjoyed the PE session where they practiced throwing and catching balls and bean bags.</p>
<p>Communication and Language</p>		<p>The children role played the story of the Gingerbread man wearing masks and looked for the story characters in the playground. They also retold the story using a story map. The children were encouraged to use the story language when making up their own stories and sharing them with their talk partners.</p>
<p>Numeracy</p>		<p>This week the children counted buttons the Gingerbread man lost when he was running. They looked for buttons in sand, playground and in the classroom. The children displayed great counting skills.</p>
<p>Literacy</p>		<p>In phonics the children continued listening for words in sentences. They focused on breaking up sentences into words and then putting it back again. The children also thought of their own sentences for their friends to jump out the words.</p>
<p>Art and Design</p>		<p>The children continued their weekly singing sessions with the music teacher. They cut out parts of the gingerbread man and put him together. The children also enjoyed making their own Gingerbread man using playdough too.</p>
<p>Understanding the World</p>		<p>Children made their own Gingerbread man. They talked about the process of making it and how he needs to be baked. The children investigated what happens if the Gingerbread man is put into different liquids – milk, water, vinegar, etc.</p>
<p>Homework</p>		<p>For homework design a picture of the Gingerbread man and label him.</p>
