



NURSERY NEWSLETTER

Topic: Changes

<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development.</p>		<p>This week the children continued talking about change. They played games and built puzzles in small groups discussing how their games have changed and what the puzzles looked like at the beginning and when they have completed them.</p>
<p>Physical Development</p>		<p>The children practised gymnastics and ball games during their PE lessons. They practiced their scissor control and playdough manipulation this week.</p>
<p>Communication and Language</p>		<p>This week the children talked, organized and sequenced pictures of the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar. They also talked about their sequence and the content of the story and answered comprehension questions. The children also retold the story and worked with their talk partner to answer comprehension questions.</p>
<p>Numeracy</p>		<p>The children worked on their counting skills and practised to form numbers using chalk, crayons, feltip pens and pencils. They also practised positional language this week.</p>
<p>Literacy</p>		<p>The children wrote the story map and then the story of the Very Hungry Caterpillar. They used their mark making skills to do that. The children also enjoyed listening to nonfiction text about butterflies.</p>
<p>Art and Design</p>		<p>The children painted caterpillars and butterflies which can be admired on our class displays. They also learned a new song about a butterfly. The children also took part in a music session.</p>
<p>Understanding the World</p>		<p>The children talked about differences and changes. Outside they looked for bugs and found a ladybird. Inside they learned about the lifecycle of a butterfly.</p>
<p>Homework</p>		<p>For homework could your child draw a picture of the lifecycle of a butterfly and explain their drawing.</p>
<p>Dates/Notes/Reminders</p> 		<p>Your child has PE on Tuesday morning. Can you please ensure your child wears socks (no leggings) on that day as the children do gymnastics barefoot. Please also ensure that your child always wears school shoes and NO trainers nor shoes or boots with laces as these are not part of the school uniform and <u>the laces create a health and safety hazard</u>.</p>
